Winter (December – March)
From -3°C to -30°C

- The darkest days – with approximately 5h-ish of daylight on late December.



Spring (April – May)
From -9°C to +15°C

- Trees and flowers pollen are high during this season.



Summer (June - August)
From +10°C to +30°C

- Daylight nearly 20 hours by late June, with only a brief, bright twilight instead of full darkness.



Autumn (September – November)
From +2°C to +15°C

- Best season to hunt northern lights and enjoy "ruska" - autumn foliage with its vibrant colors.

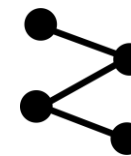
